Dept. of Motor Vehicles The DMV will be at the Town Hall from 10 AM to 2:30 PM on September 11th and October 16th.

Food Drive The Sullivan County Town Clerks are sponsoring a non-perishable food drive during the month of September. You may drop off your donations during regular office hours at the Town of Neversink Town Hall. All donations will go to our local food pantry which is located at the Grahamsville United Methodist Church.

General Election *Mail Registration*-applications must be postmarked not later than October 10th and received by Board of Elections not later than October 15th to be eligible to vote in the General Election. *In-Person Registration*-to be eligible to vote in the November general election, your application must be received no later than October 10th except if you have been honorably discharged from the military or have become a naturalized citizen since October 10th, you may register in person at the board of elections up until October 24th. *Change of Address*-Notices of change of address from registered voters received by October 15th by a county board of elections must be processed and entered in the records in time for the general election. *Absentee Ballots*-mail one month prior to allow time for mail processing.

Hazardous Waste Days September 7th is the only remaining day left for Household Hazardous Waste Cleanup. The Household Hazardous Waste Cleanup event is open only to Sullivan County residents who pre-register for the event. For further info, call Bill Cutler at 794-4466 ext. 301.

Hunting License Hunting licenses for the 08-09 hunting season are now on sale. The instant lottery for DMPs began on August 18th and runs through October 1st at the end of the business day. Southern zone bow deer hunting season begins on October 18th. Southern zone regular deer hunting season begins on November 15th. Hunting licenses and DMPs can be purchased at the Town Clerk's Office from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

Litterpluck This year the County has designated Saturday, September 13th as Fall Litterpluck Day. Any residents/groups who wish to participate in Litterpluck must register in person and pick up Litterpluck materials any time on or after Friday, September 5th at the Town of Neversink Town Hall. You may "litterpluck" anytime from September 6th through the 20th. Detailed instructions will be given when bags are picked up. For further info, please call 985-2262 ext. 300 or 307.

NY-ALERT At July's Town Board meeting, a representative from Sullivan County's Emergency Management office explained to us a new program, NY-ALERT, which is also known as New York State's All-Hazards Alert & Notification System. This program encourages individuals to sign up and receive emergency information such as major road closures and weather events and what protective actions are recommended by State, local governments and the private sector where appropriate. Rally NY As you all remember back in the spring of this year the Town Board approved Rally NY to hold a road rally in our town in the Willowemoc area. After listening to the concerns of the residents of the Willowemoc area, the Town Board has decided that it will not entertain a three-year proposal for Rally NY, and there is a likelihood that there will no longer be road rallies in our town.

Sewer Project Update Neighborhood meetings have been scheduled for September 17th (6:30 PM for Projects 1&2: State Rte. 55, Hastings Dr. & Hastings Ct.; and 8:00 PM for Projects 3&4: State Rte. 42, Big Hollow Rd., Rocky Hill Rd. & VanWagner Rd.) to answer questions pertaining to the hook-up of the new sewer as well as the de-commissioning of your existing septic system.

Transfer Station In an effort to maximize the capacity of the plastic recycle bin at the transfer station, we are asking residents to compress their plastics, especially milk containers, before placing in bins. Unfortunately, if this is not done, the bin quickly becomes full, needs to be closed, and the only other option is to bring your recyclables back home for your next trip or to put in with the garbage, which we don't want to do. By compressing your plastics, this should help to alleviate the continuing problem of closing the bins because of being at full capacity.
