Outdoor Burners **REMINDER:** OBs located in RC, RR2 and RR3 zoning districts, on lots of 5 acres or more, and more than 100 feet from the nearest property line may be operated year-round. ***All other OBs shall be operated only between October 1st and May 1st.***
