

TOWN OF NEVERSINK POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

These rules have been established for the safety, well-being and comfort of all individuals using the pool. Those who do not wish to adhere to them will be asked to leave the pool. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

- All residents must have a Town of Neversink Pool Pass on file in order to enter.
- All children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times. Additionally, non-swimming children under the age of 12 must be accompanied and supervised in the water by a parent or guardian at all times.
- Children under 16 years of age will not be allowed in or admitted to the pool area after 5:00 pm without a parent or guardian.
- The Kiddie-Pool shall be used for pre-school and non-swimmers only who are accompanied by a parent or guardian. *Non Swimming parent passes are available for the kiddie pool area at no charge.* Untrained babies/toddlers should be in swim appropriate swim diapers and/or rubber pants.
- A parent/guardian may be responsible for only one non-swimmer in the pool at a time.
- Only Coast Guard approved flotation devices will be allowed in the pool.
- Appropriate swim attire is required to be allowed in the pool. Cutoffs are not acceptable.
- Patrons who cannot stand chest deep in the non-diving area must take a swimming test.
- Patrons must pass a deep water test in order to swim in the diving area.
- Persons having skin lesions, sore or inflamed eyes, mouth, nose or ear discharges or who are known to be a carrier of the microorganisms of any communicable diseases may not use the swimming pool.
- All persons are required to take a soap and water shower prior to entering the pool.
- Management is not responsible for lost or stolen belongings.
- Running and roughhouse activities around the pool area are prohibited.
- Eating, drinking and smoking are not allowed within the pool enclosure. Designated eating areas are provided.
- Profane language will not be tolerated at any time.
- Rafts, tubes, snorkels, fins and other equipment will not be allowed in the pool except for use during special activities.

GUEST POLICY

- ALL GUESTS must be accompanied by a resident pass holder. *The resident pass holder must be of a sufficient age as to be able to be responsible for their guests and their actions.*
- Guests must be registered in the Pool Director's Office in order to receive a guest day pass. Their guest day passes MUST be returned to the Pool Office at the end of the day. Failure to return the guest day pass will result in possible denial of admission of that person upon their next visit to the pool.
- In the event that the Pool reaches maximum occupancy level, non-resident swimmers would be asked to leave the pool first.

PASS HOLDERS MUST CALL THE POOL AT 985-7490 TO MAKE A RESERVATION FOR A SWIM SESSION. RESERVATIONS MUST BE MADE AT LEAST ONE HOUR BEFORE THE SESSION AND/OR UP TO TWO WEEKS AHEAD.

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Dear Patrons,

First and foremost, we hope that you and your loved ones are safe and healthy. We have received questions from the community about if and how COVID-19 will change the way we operate our venue. After careful consideration, I am excited to let you know that we plan to reopen while following CDC guidance to protect our swimmers, staff, and our community.

The health and safety of our swimmers, staff, and other patrons remains our highest priority. Below you will find a summary of actions we are taking to help ensure we are lowering COVID-19 risk as much as possible while also allowing our swimmers and patrons to enjoy the water. We are:

- Promoting healthy hygiene practices, such as: encouraging all staff, patrons, and swimmers to stay home if they are unwell, wash their hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes and wear cloth face coverings at all times when not in the water.
 - Cloth face coverings **should not be placed** on children younger than 2 years of age, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the cover without assistance.
- Taking temperature readings of all patrons upon facility entrance and we will ask you to respond to the COVID-19 screening assessment. Hand hygiene stations will be located at the pool entrance [next to the diving well] and exit [next to the building] and by the water fountain on the building deck. We will be increasing cleaning, disinfection, and ventilation within our facilities by cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces, such as handrails, ladders, diving board rails, tables, aquatic lift, faucets and door handles. In addition to the bathroom sinks, we are also adding handwashing stations, having adequate hand sanitizer, tissues and paper towels. We are opening windows and doors in indoor spaces, making sure that we have safe and correct use and storage of disinfectants. Our disinfectants are EPA approved.
- Encouraging social distancing when possible by changing deck layouts to ensure patrons can remain 6 feet apart in standing and seating areas, providing lane lines in water and visual cues like tape on floors and sidewalks, staggering use of communal spaces such as bathrooms and shower/dressing rooms, limiting large group events on premises and offering swim sessions. We are taking session phone reservations at 985-7490 one-hour before the session and/or up to two weeks ahead, so we can clean and disinfect between patron usage.
- Ensuring adequate supplies are available to limit the sharing of equipment, such as: pool noodles, kick boards, chairs and tables and discouraging using or sharing when items are difficult to clean, sanitize, or disinfect such as goggles, nose plugs and snorkels.

In the event someone gets sick, we have plans in place to isolate and transport the person to their home or healthcare facility, and we will work with local health officials.
