- **Jim Stangel,** Planning Board Chairman, gave a brief summary of business that has been before the Planning Board.
- Dave Moore reviewed with the Board the distribution of the \$10,000 prize that was won by Neversink Renaissance. \$4,000 is going to Little League for a dugouts, \$4,000 is going to the Museum for the next phase of the Lost Farm project up on the hill and Neversink Renaissance is going to keep \$2,000 and is looking into possibly purchasing replacement banners for the Town.
