- ➤ **Tri-Valley FFA** presented the Ag Issues Forum about the plight of the Indiana Bat in relationships to construction along the Route 17M corridor and the tree ban that is in effect because of this endangered species. The students involved have already won at the district and sub-state level and will soon be competing at the state level.
- > Steve Porter reported on his attendance at the Community Choice Aggregation Workshop held at the Government Center in Monticello. He also suggested to the Board that the Town's Master Plan be re-examined and possibly updated.
- Route 42 Community Park water testing is required before the Department of Health will allow the use of the water for anything else other than the flushing of toilets. Supervisor Mathews will be working on this. Little League is requesting permission to put in speed limit signs and speed
