- Adele Barnard spoke to the Board asking that they consider looking into putting in a playground at the Route 42 Community Park. Adele shared pictures of playgrounds in both Sullivan and Ulster County that she has visited. She has researched the idea, including reaching out to other municipalities with playgrounds, and shared her findings. The Board suggested that a committee be formed. Councilwoman Nicole Gorr will serve on that committee. Cher Woehl, Parks and Recreation Director, will also meet with Adele to discuss the idea.
- > Kitty Vetter was present tonight with questions about Kerilands. Kitty watched the April 26th presentation and has some concerns about the project. Her concerns included: the possible need to expand Pole Road and who would be responsible for the cost, setback requirements to adjoining property owners and what is allowed and not allowed in the RC zone in which the property is located. Councilman Richard Coombe Jr. suggested that the Board read aloud the letter that has been drafted to Garigliano Law Offices from Supervisor Mathews in response to the possible Kerilands Development Proposal. Supervisor Mathew's read the letter aloud. The letter is asking for additional information regarding the Kerilands Project before scheduling the joint Town/Planning Board meeting that was requested by Kerilands. Also included in the letter is a binding agreement that Kerilands pay and fund an escrow for all Town Costs, including legal and consultants, and all litigation that may result. The following Resolution was introduced to authorize the sending of the letter to Barbara Garigliano, Esq., in reference to the possible Kerilands Development Proposal:

WHEREAS, at a Town Board meeting on April 26, 2021, Jonathan Leitersdorf and his team ("Developer") made an informal presentation regarding a possible development proposal encompassing $\pm 3,150$ acres in the Town, referred to as the "Kerilands Project"; and

WHEREAS, the Kerilands Project would be located generally between Pole Road, Blue Hill Road and Hunter Road; and

WHEREAS, as presented, the Kerilands Project would consist of the following uses, which may change: residential, recreation (indoor and outdoor), hospitality, commercial and retail; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board believes such a project could benefit the Town and is willing to proceed with consideration of it in accordance with law and in a manner that is protective of the Town's interests; and

WEHEREAS, Developer has requested that the Town Board schedule a joint meeting of the Town Board and Planning Board to present the Kerilands Project; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board is willing to do so after it receives information described in the attached letter, which the Town Board believes is critical to gaining a better understanding of, and to enable meaningful feedback on, the Kerilands Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached letter is approved and the Supervisor is authorized to execute and send such letter; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, within a reasonable time after receiving the information requested in such letter, the Town Board will schedule the requested joint meeting.
