> Brandon Rubik and Joan Mingo discussed AYSO and the Route 42 Park lease presented to them by the Town. AYSO has concerns regarding the lease including: not having enough volunteers for garbage pick-up and bathroom cleaning. AYSO's goal is to keep kids playing and active within the community. After a misunderstanding last year, AYSO would like the Town's support in helping with the garbage/bathrooms. Councilperson Scott Grey and Councilperson Richard Coombe, Jr. both simply asked that AYSO pay attention to the state of the bathrooms/garbage when the fields are in use by the league and clean-up accordingly. Brandon Rubik agreed and said that checklists could be done when AYSO gets to the fields and when they leave the fields to make sure that everything is in order. The Town Board stressed that the ballfields were built for the community, that no rent is charged to Youth Organizations, as long as those organizations and community volunteers continue to help maintain the fields, keep facilities clean and keep up with the garbage. Otherwise, rent will need to be charged and the park put on a maintenance schedule that may not line up with when the youth organizations need the fields to be cut or cut to a specific specification. Joan Mingo asked that Park Rules be posted to help get the word out regarding proper park usage and to stress the importance of cleaning up after yourself when at the park. Town Board agreed and stated they will go through the AYSO's red-line items within the lease and respond back to AYSO in a timely manner.
